## SCRAMBLED EGGS AND SOUP

This quilt was designed for a quilt show which took place at the co-conference of the Oregon Association of Family and Consumer Sciences and the Oregon Dietetic Association. Individuals associated with O.S.U. were invited to make food-related quilts.

The design inspiration for this quilt was a 1930s advertisement for canned milk which featured several different illustrations of food. I began with an initial illustration of the different meals featured and scanned the illustration into Photoshop 5. The image was scrambled and additional colors and shapes were added for balance and interest. The resultant design was enlarged.

The fabric is 100% cotton. The pieces representing the food matches the colors from the original. Fabrics with curved lines were used for the "china" plate edges. During the assembly process part of the original scrambled design was rearranged. All pieces were machine appliquéd. The piece was machine quilted in four plate shapes. Two borders were added; the inner green was a complement to the background fabric and outer border of dark rose.
