The Newspaper

The Prospectus published its first issue in 1968, shortly after Parkland College held its first classes, and has been published continuously ever since. The content of the newspaper is chosen, written, and edited by the students, thereby allowing readers a glimpse into the diverse voices and unique perspectives that comprise Parkland's student body.



The Grant

In 2022, two librarians embarked on a project to assess, inventory, digitize, preserve, and increase accessibility of the archives' complete collection of *The Prospectus*. To do this, they applied for and received an Illinois State Records Advisory Board (ISHRAB) Historical Records Grant to help with the cost of digitization and purchasing supplies. The grant also provided an opportunity to pay a University of Illinois iSchool student for a practicum to assist with metadata and uploading the images to SPARK, Parkland's institutional repository.

Assessment

The Prospectus collection consists of physical newspapers, microfilm, and born digital issues. An assessment of the physical newspapers revealed that the earliest editions were becoming brittle and discolored. Offering microfilm access is also a problem due to the increasing obsolescence of this technology. It was determined that digitization and rehousing would provide the best protection and increase opportunities for access.

The Prospectus collection contains 1,153 printed issues that were not created electronically, 732 of which were previously microfilmed. Issues from 2011 to 2020 were born digital and most had been added to SPARK prior to this project. PDFs were also submitted to the Illinois Digital Newspaper Collections (IDNC) in March of 2022 for increased access and preservation.

We chose to work with Apex CoVantage based on a recommendation from Will Schlaack, Digital Reformatting Coordinator at the University of Illinois, who manages the IDNC. Digitizing the print and microfilm issues cost \$8,558.51, which was shared by grant funding and Parkland.

Apex digitized the microfilm and provided metadata while partnering with Backstage Library Works to digitize the physical issues of *The Prospectus*. All of our microfilm and newspapers returned from the digitization process in great condition!
