Berea College Special Collections and Archives (SCA) has advanced two staff members in recent months. In June, Special Collections and Archives assistant **Lizzie Doerr** was promoted to the position of research services specialist, representing a move from temporary to regular status leading departmental public services. In July, project archivist **Peter Morphew** was promoted to the position of collections archivist, moving from annual contract work on the Janis Ian archives to regular status managing all nonaudiovisual holdings in the repository. Berea is also pleased to share that folklorist **Emily Hilliard**'s position has been renewed for a three-year term. Hilliard joined the Special Collections and Archives department in 2023. Her work has added significantly to SCA's campus engagement while also augmenting SCA's holdings of student-based oral histories.

Kayla Harris has been appointed associate dean for special collections and executive director of the Marian Library at the University of Dayton. With this appointment, she directs the Marian Library, the US Catholic Special Collection, and the University Archives and Special Collections.

Sarah Hensler joined the Archdiocese of Cincinnati Archives as the new assistant archivist in June 2025. Hensler earned her MLS from Indiana University, where she focused on manuscripts, religious records, and historical research support. During

her graduate studies, she served as the sole archival processor for the Baker Street Irregulars Manuscript Collection at the Lilly Library, where she managed over 80 cubic feet of manuscripts, audiovisual materials, and born-digital oral histories. She also served as project coordinator for the Kripke Accession Project, leading the first comprehensive accessioning of a 20,000-item lexicography collection spanning five centuries. Hensler's enthusiasm for archival work and her detail-oriented approach to managing collections make her a valuable asset to the team at the Archdiocese of Cincinnati Archives.

Cortney Mihulka is the new processing archivist at the Wisconsin Veterans Museum and will be responsible for arranging and describing manuscript collections relating to Wisconsin veterans from the Civil War to the present. Mihulka received an MLIS from the University of Wisconsin–Madison

and previously worked at the Wisconsin Historical Society, George Washington University, and Johnson Health Tech.

Katrina Rouan has been appointed director of the Walter P. Reuther Library and Archives of Labor and Urban Affairs at Wayne State University. Rouan has served as interim director of the Reuther Library since 2024 and brings extensive experience from within the Wayne State University Libraries. From 2010 to 2024, she served as a librarian, holding positions that included coordinator for reference services and graduate student assistants, as well as subject specialist librarian for the departments of psychology, communication sciences and disorders, and nutrition and food science.
