## THE AMERICAN JOURNAL OF CONCHOLOGY

## AURÈLE LA ROCOUE

The last year of a war hardly seems the time to start a new journal, yet that is just when the energetic George W. Tryon, Jr. launched the American Journal of Conchology. The project must have been discussed and carefully planned beforehand among Philadelphia conchologists for the papers published in the very first issue are excellent, the typographic make-up and the illustrations are the best available at the time. During its short life the journal maintained high standards of content and form equal to those of its contemporaries in Europe. How it came into existence, how it was financed, how many copies of each issue were printed and why it was decided to discontinue it are questions to which I cannot presently give answers; the latter would throw interesting light on the history of conchology in the seventh and eighth decades of the nineteenth century. The United States did not have a regular journal of conchology until 1888 when Pilsbry took over and transformed the Conchologists' Exchange and renamed it the NAUTI-LUS.

Just how many sets of the American Journal of Conchology have survived to the present would be a difficult question to answer. It is not as widely represented in libraries as one would wish. Fifty-one complete or partial sets are listed for American and Canadian libraries in the "Union List of Serials," its supplements, and the "Union List of Scientific Serials in Canadian Libraries." We may suppose that an equal, perhaps a greater, number are in European libraries and some sets may still be in private hands here and

abroad. It would be interesting to know how many copies of each issue were printed and to examine mailing lists for each volume of the Journal.

This paper is mainly concerned with listing the contents of the American Journal of Conchology and the libraries where it is available. The author list was prepared from the set of the Journal in the Library of the Geological Survey of Canada and the list of libraries from the Union Lists mentioned above. Both were made available to the writer by Mrs. N. I. Kummerman, Librarian of the Geological Survey of Canada. Her helpful co-operation is gratefully acknowledged.
